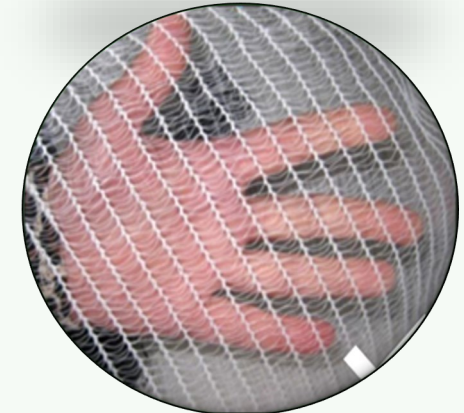

**“CHOOSE WILDLIFE FRIENDLY NETTING”**

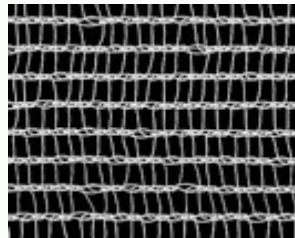
Wildlife friendly netting is netting you cannot push your fingers through with an aperture no bigger than 5 x 5 mm fully stretched.

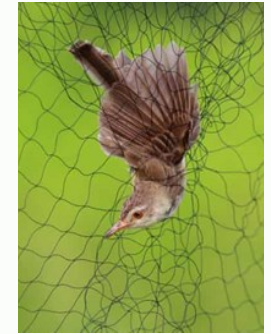
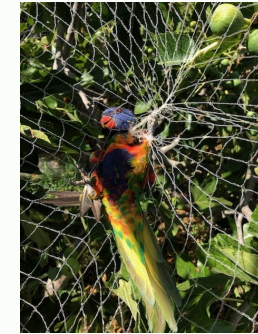

## ALL WILDLIFE IS AT RISK

All wildlife is dangerous when trapped.



Birds, possums, lizards, snakes and bats are the main victims of unsafe netting.

Animals become entangled and cannot free themselves. While struggling to escape, the net cuts ever deeper into the animal.



### IMPORTANT MESSAGE - THE LAWS ARE CHANGING

In Victoria from September 2021, it will be illegal to sell or use netting on domestic fruit trees unless it has an aperture no bigger than 5 x 5 mm fully stretched. It is likely other Australian States will adopt similar restrictions.
