
BUSINESS SUSTAINABILITY – THE GAME CHANGER


For businesses wanting to make change that is visible to staff, and potentially customers, improving material waste management is a good place to start.

First, audit, assess and evaluate your waste in all its forms.

- What's in the bins? Why is it there?
- What's being wasted that might be recovered or reused?
- Ask key suppliers if they can reduce the amount of packaging sent to your business, or supply products in returnable containers.
- See if any materials can be separated into recycling or organics collections to divert them from landfill.
- Find out if any nearby businesses might be able to use your waste output as a material input.

You can apply key principles for waste management across many aspects of your business. For example, the waste management hierarchy establishes an order of preference for material management.
