



SALA @ THE SUMMIT

Highlights from SALA

SALA at The Summit was once again a resounding success with many people visiting the exhibition throughout August, including around 170 people at the opening event. The theme of this year's exhibition was Adelaide Hills Biodiversity - Artwork reflecting biodiversity across the Mount Lofty Ranges region. There was overwhelming interest in the exhibition from artists in the community and this year, 49 artists entered 104 artworks into the exhibition, including paintings, textiles, photography, ceramics, and various other mediums.

The exhibition was a partnership event between The Summit Community Centre and the Hills Environment Centre with the Best Environmental Artwork Award being presented to Ingrid Mangan for her watercolour and ink on paper works, 'Pond Life' and 'Birds and Banksias'. The People's Choice Award recipient for the second year running, is Veronica Oborn Jefferis for her scraper board piece, 'Tone and Texture'.

This year a Children's Art Competition with the same theme was run in conjunction with the exhibition. 27 entries were received from children aged 5 – 18 years. The winners of the competition are Elliot Quirk, aged 7, Sam Quirk, aged 9, Remy Rettig, aged 10 and Shradha Manoj Namboodiri, aged 14.
