Mr Waters also led the Council's recovery efforts following the Sampson Flat (2015) and Cudlee Creek (2019) bushfires.



"I would like to thank our CEO, my colleagues and the elected members for their ongoing support. I wish them every success and will watch on with interest from further up the freeway."


